

## **Watercolor with Pen & Ink**

### Supply List

Watercolor brushes: #8 or #6 round, #10 flat and a #0 or #1

Tubes of Grumbacher or Winsor Newton watercolors (other off- brands of paint will not give you good results.) You will need: Cadmium Red, Cadmium Yellow (light), Cobalt Blue, Sap Green, and Burnt Sienna.

Two Fine tip permanent black drawing pens Prismacolor or Pitt pens are good choices or others, as long as they are not water soluble.

Strathmore watercolor tablet (140 lb. and no smaller than a 9" x 12")

Pencil

White plastic eraser (will not leave smudges on the paper)

Natural sponge

Kitchen sponge

Painter's tape (Green "Frog Tape" is the best)

Large size white facial tissues

Spritz bottle (plastic bottle with a fine mist spray);

Scissors (any size)

You will need a surface on which to tape the sheet of watercolor paper (cookie sheets work very well, or a sheet of plywood cut to size (11 x 14), or order the "Incredible Foam Art Board" from Dick Blick on-line or at the Galesburg, Illinois location)

Palette: You may use Heavy duty paper plates or purchase a watercolor palette with a lid

"Mr. Clean Magic Eraser" (these will be cut into smaller pieces for correcting mistakes)

One tablet of tracing paper

Cloth rags or paper towels for clean up;

Plastic tablecloth for covering the work surface

Water containers and graphite paper will be provided
